
From Awareness to Action: Tackling the Root Causes of Violence Against Women and Girls

While data indicate a relative decline, largely due to increased awareness efforts, stakeholders must go further by addressing the underlying norms and practices that perpetuate such violence.



Trends and Flashpoints of Violence Against Women & Girls in the Niger Delta




Anticipated Trends and Dynamics


VAWG could escalate in the region, given historical data and recent trends influenced by socio-economic factors. This poses a serious threat to socio-economic development and human security, further marginalizing women and girls while destabilizing communities.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Civil society organizations and local peace actors are addressing VAWG through advocacy and awareness-raising efforts. However, stronger remedial and punitive measures are needed to tackle its root causes, including harmful norms and socio-economic factors.
