

# Conflict Incident Monthly Tracker

## Akwa Ibom State: November-December 2016

### Background

This monthly tracker is designed to update Peace Agents on patterns and trends in conflict risk and violence, as identified by the Integrated Peace and Development Unit (IPDU) early warning system, and to seek feedback and input for response to mitigate areas of conflict.

### Patterns and Trends September-November 2016

According to Peace Map data (see Figure 1), conflict incidents reported during the period included communal tensions, criminality, mob violence, and protests.

**Communal Tensions:** In November, nine people, including a police officer, were reportedly injured when youth from Amazaba attacked Ikot Akpan Udo village in Ikot Abasi LGA over a protracted land dispute. Separately, a local chief was reportedly arrested over an attempt to assassinate a paramount ruler in Uyo.

**Criminality:** In September, a police corporal was reportedly killed by robbers in Etinam LGA. In October, the executive secretary of the Obudu Urban Development Authority was reportedly kidnapped in Obudu LGA. Separately, four oil thieves were reportedly arrested in Ataba LGA. In November, a politician and businessman was reportedly kidnapped along with his wife on their way from the Ibom International Airport in Uyo.

**Child Trafficking:** In October, a 51-year old woman was reportedly arrested for buying a 2-month old baby for 450,000 Naira in Uyo. Separately, 11 suspected child traffickers were reportedly arrested by police in Uyo. In November, a woman was reportedly arrested for stealing her neighbor's baby girl in Itu LGA.

**Mob Violence:** In September, a mob reportedly chopped off the hand of a robbery suspect in Uyo LGA. Separately, a policeman was reportedly mobbed by residents for allegedly causing a road accident in Uyo LGA.

**Protest:** In November, there was reportedly a protest over contracts for the clean up of an oil spill in Esit Eket LGA. Separately, there was reportedly a protest by students of the University of Uyo over school fees.

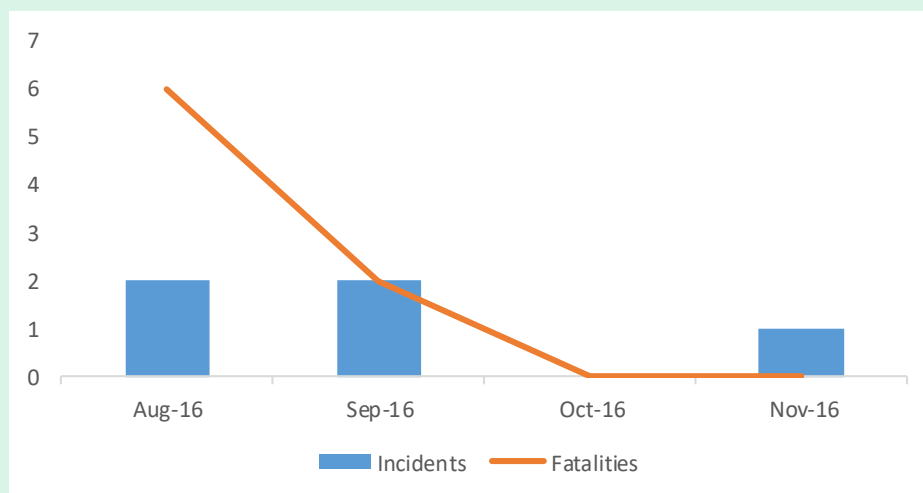
### Recent Incidents or Issues, December 2016

Incidents of conflict risk and violence reported in December included communal tensions, child trafficking and infrastructural disasters.

**Communal Tensions/Violence:** During the month, ten people were reportedly killed during a clash between communities in Odukpani in Cross River state and Itu LGA. In a separate incident, a clash between communities in Ikot Offiong and Okuiboku in Itu LGA reportedly resulted in 15 fatalities, burned houses and kidnappings.

**Protests:** Youth reportedly blocked the entrance of a multinational oil company in protest of the termination of contract

workers. Separately, families of deceased teachers in the state reportedly protested over payment of pensions and gratuities in Uyo, the state capital.

**Building Collapse:** During the month, 29 people were reportedly killed and several other sustained different degrees of injuries following the collapse of a church building in Uyo, the state capital. Separately, two people were reported killed and 17 other injured following the collapse of a market structure in Onna LGA.

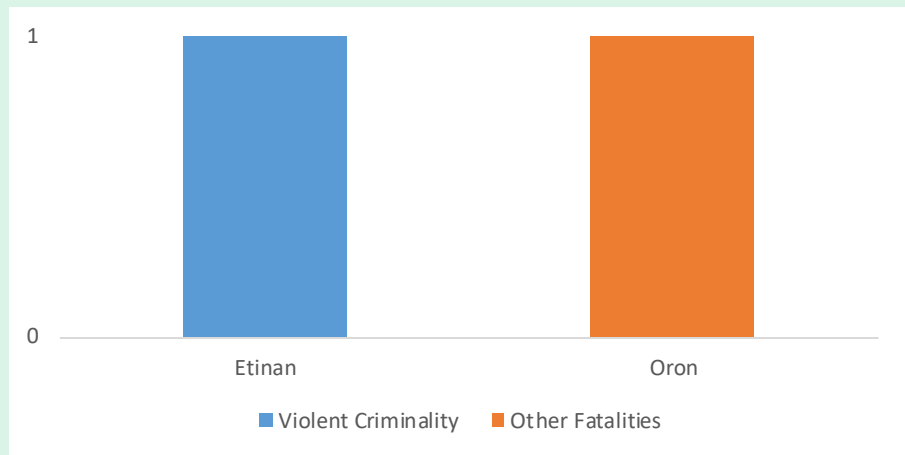
## Prognosis

Conflict risk in the state during this period are mainly related to criminality, communal tensions, child trafficking and protests. Peace actors should monitor the situation closely.

## Questions for Peace Agents

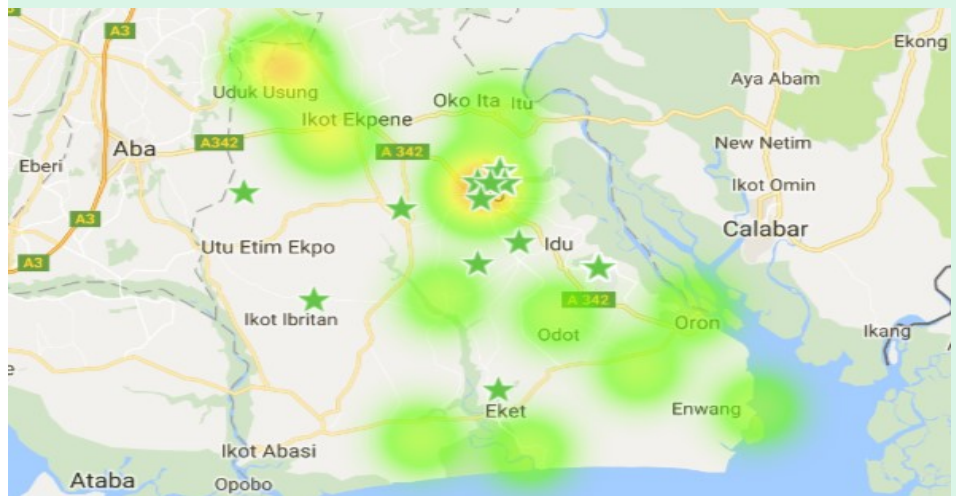
1. Is there anything significant missing from the tracker in terms of hotspots, trends, or incidents?
