

Conflict Incident Monthly Tracker

Edo State: November-December 2016

Background

This monthly tracker is designed to update Peace Agents on patterns and trends in conflict risk and violence, as identified by the Integrated Peace and Development Unit (IPDU) early warning system, and to seek feedback and input for response to mitigate areas of conflict.

Patterns and Trends September-November 2016

According to Peace Map data (see Figure 1), incidents reported during the period included cult violence, criminality, communal and political tensions, and protests.

Cult Violence: In November, four people were reportedly killed during a clash between members of the Black Axe and Eiye confraternities at Auchu Polytechnic in Etsako West LGA during a graduation ceremony.

Violent Criminality: In October, police reportedly killed a kidnapper in Oredo LGA. Separately, a member of a vigilante group was reportedly killed by kidnappers in Uhumwonde. In November, a community leader was reportedly killed by unknown assailants in his residence in Ovia South-West LGA. Also, a 20-year old man reportedly killed a man and stole his motorcycle in Ovia South-West LGA. Separately, robbers reportedly attacked the home of a university lecturer in Egor LGA

and killed his 4-year old daughter. In another incident, two robbers were reportedly killed by police in Benin City, the state capital.

Communal Tensions: In October, police reportedly arrested the village head of Azagba community in Uhumwonde and nine other persons over a communal clash.

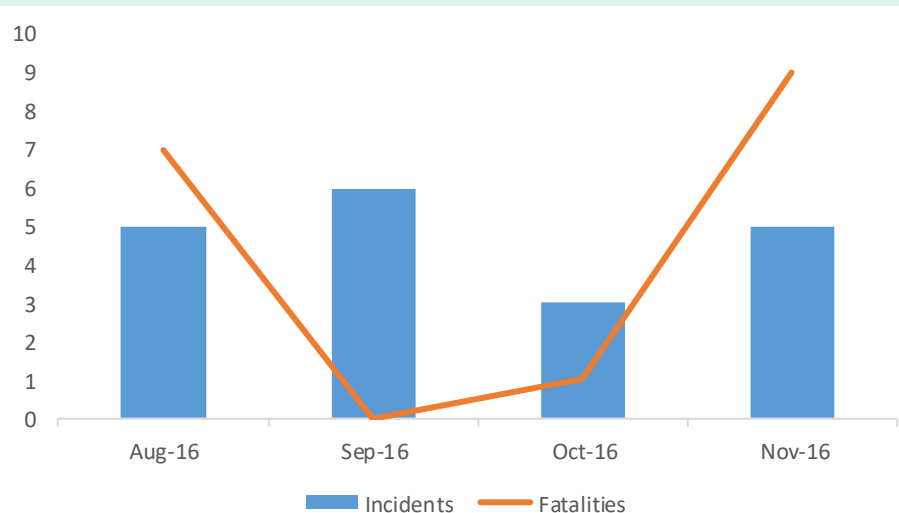
Protest: In October, People's Democratic Party (PDP) supporters reportedly protested in Oredo and Etsako West LGAs over alleged manipulation of the results of the concluded gubernatorial elections in the state. Separately, market women reportedly protested over plans by government to relocate traders.

Recent Incidents or Issues, December 2016

Incidents reported in Edo state in December are mainly related to cult violence, and protests.

Cult Violence: During the month several incidents of cult violence were reported in Benin City, the state capital. A young man was reportedly shot dead by cultists. Separately, three persons were reportedly killed during a rival cult clash. In another incident, a professional footballer who was on holiday in the state was reportedly killed by cultists in a drinking spot. Following renewed gang violence, the Police declared war on cultism in the state.

Protests: There was a reported protest over the state Government suspension of a traditional ruler, the Onojie of Uromi in Esan North-East. The protesters demanded the reinstatement of the ruler. Separately, commercial bus operators reportedly protested following the killing of their colleague by street gangs in Benin City.

Other Incidents: A man was reportedly killed by a stray bullet fired by a policeman at a wedding ceremony in Oredo.

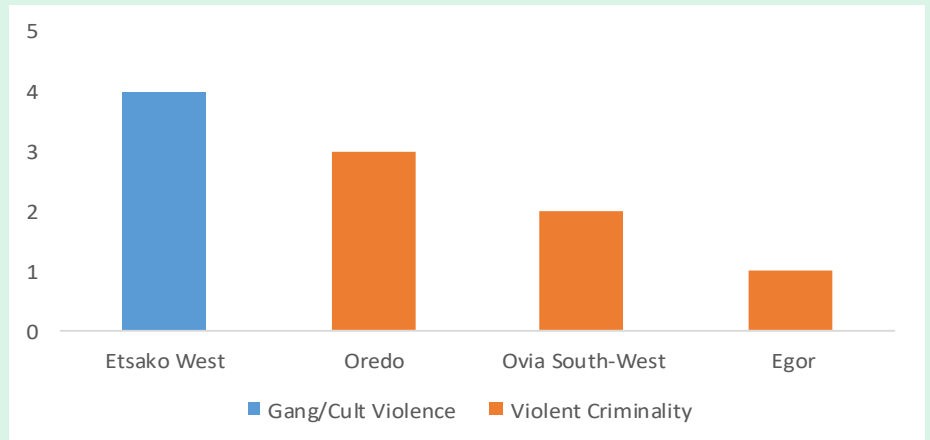
Prognosis

The key issues reported during this period included criminality, cult violence, protests, and communal tensions. There was an increase of cult violence in the state in December 2016. Peace Actors should monitor the security situation closely and respond appropriately.

Questions for Peace Agents

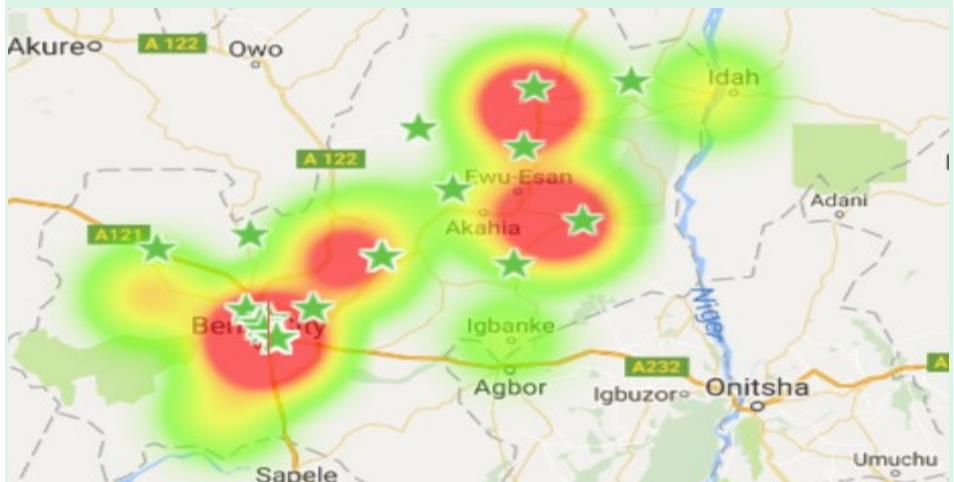
1. Is there anything significant missing from the tracker in terms of hotspots, trends, or incidents?

5. What will you do to help mitigate the conflict in the short, medium, and long term?
