

Conflict Incident Monthly Tracker

Abia State: December 2016-January 2017

Background

This monthly tracker is designed to update Peace Agents on patterns and trends in conflict risk and violence, as identified by the Integrated Peace and Development Unit (IPDU) early warning system, and to seek feedback and input for response to mitigate areas of conflict.

Patterns and Trends October-December 2016

According to Peace Map data (see Figure 1), reported incidents related mainly to communal tensions, political violence, criminality, and protests.

Communal Tension: In November, tensions were reportedly heightened in Arochukwu LGA following a clash involving herdsmen and farmers in Ndi Okereke community. In December, tension was reported in Bende LGA following a clash that destroyed crops and resulted in injuries. Separately, gunmen reportedly attacked a community in Isiala-Ngwa North LGA, killing three people and injuring ten others. The attack was reportedly in revenge for the death of a colleague who was killed the previous week.

Political Violence: In December, twenty people were reportedly injured during a clash between APC and PDP supporters over the destruction of campaign posters during a political rally in Obi-Ngwa LGA.

Violent Criminality: In November, the deputy chairman of the Abia State Chapter

of the Nigeria Union of Local Government Employees (NULGE) was reportedly abducted in Aba North LGA. Separately, a man was reportedly fatally shot by a policeman in Osisioma. In December, two kidnappers were reportedly shot dead by soldiers in Osisioma-Ngwa LGA while attempting to abduct a man.

Labor Strikes/Protests: In October, tensions were reportedly elevated in Aba South after a protest by residents over the takeover of a piece of land by a company. In December, there was a protest by staff of the Abia State Polytechnic over salaries in Aba.

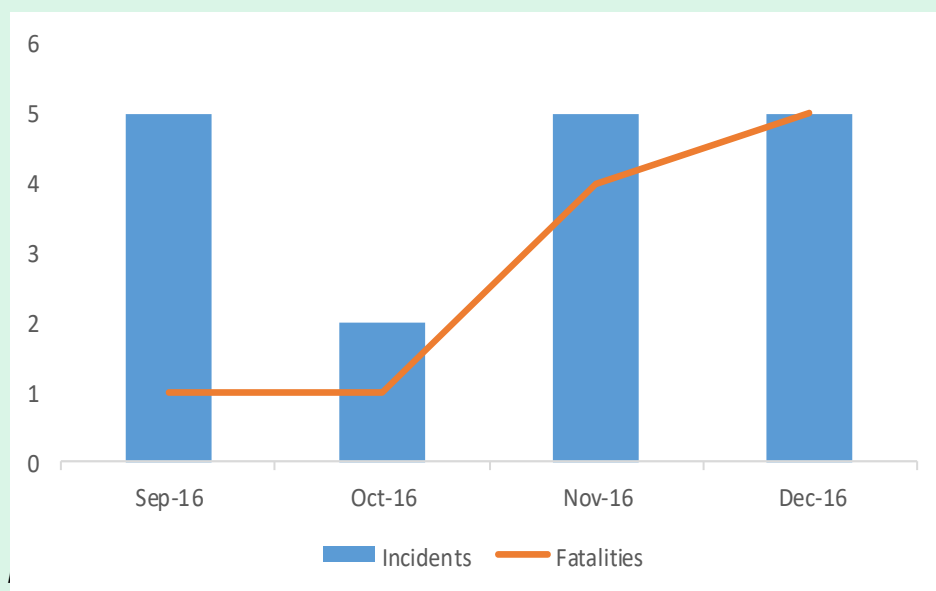
Other Incidents: In November, a 60-year-old man reportedly raped and strangled a 36-year-old woman in Amaekpu community, Ohafia LGA. In December, a woman reportedly stabbed her neighbor's son to death in Umuahia North LGA.

Recent Incidents or Issues, January 2017

Incidents of conflict risk and violence that were reported in January included criminality and labor strikes/protests.

Criminality: During the month, police arrested suspects for robbery, kidnapping, and vandalism in the state. Police reportedly killed a kidnapper while picking up the ransom for an abducted victim in Osisioma. Separately, the police reportedly arrested a member of a gang that robbed a couple of a sum of money in Umuahia South. In another incident, soldiers reportedly burned down a house allegedly used as hideout by kidnappers in Osisioma.

Labor Strikes/Protests: During the month the state chapter of the Academic Staff Union of polytechnic (ASUP), Senior Staff Association of Nigeria Polytechnic (SSANIP), and Non-Academic Staff Union (NASU) reportedly embarked on a labor strike over salaries. Separately, teachers in primary and secondary schools reportedly embarked on labor strikes in protest over salaries in Umuahia North.

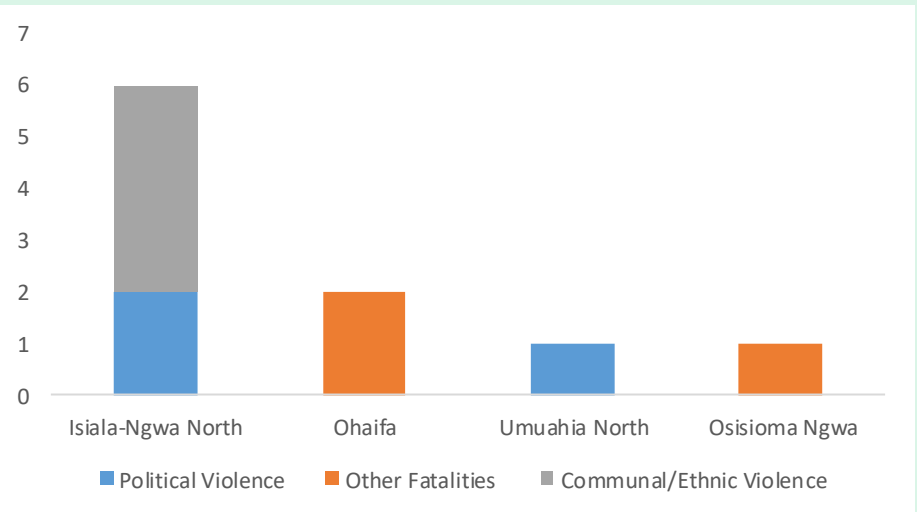
Prognosis

Reported incidents during the period included criminality, communal and political tensions, and labor strikes/protests. Peace agents should monitor the security situation closely and respond appropriately.

Questions for Peace Agents

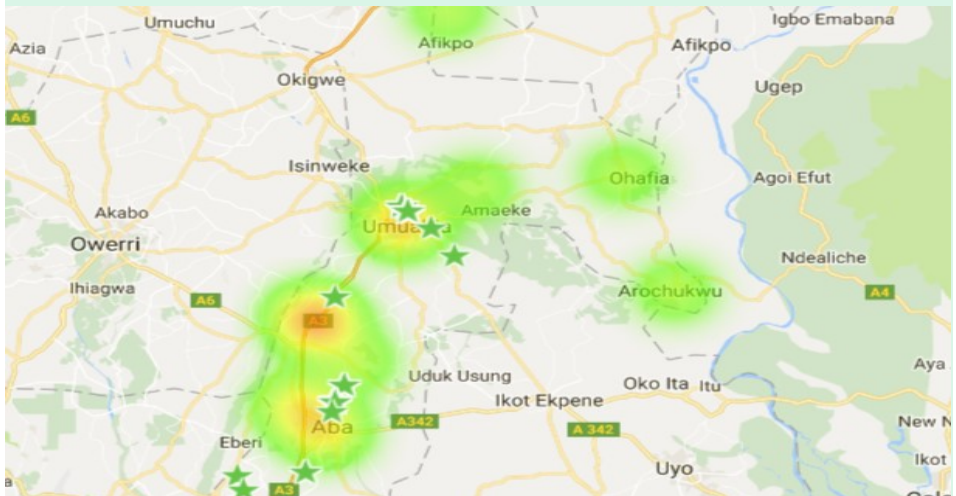
1. Is there anything significant missing from the tracker in terms of hotspots, trends, or incidents?
2. Which conflict issue or potential conflict issue suggested by, or missing from, this tracker is a top priority for you (as P4P Chapter, Prevent Committee, or other stakeholder)?
3. What are some likely trigger events in the next 6 months that could escalate this conflict?
4. Who are the key stakeholders that have influence on the conflict?
5. What will you do to help mitigate the conflict in the short, medium, and long term?
