

Conflict Incident Monthly Tracker

Edo State: January-February 2017

Background

This monthly tracker is designed to update Peace Agents on patterns and trends in conflict risk and violence, as identified by the Integrated Peace and Development Unit (IPDU) early warning system, and to seek feedback and input for response to mitigate areas of conflict.

Patterns and Trends November 2016- January 2017

According to Peace Map data (see Figure 1), incidents reported during the period included cult violence, criminality, communal tensions, and protests.

Gang/Cult Violence: In December, several incidents of cult violence were reported in Benin City, the state capital. A young man was reportedly killed by cultists. Separately, three persons were reportedly killed during a rival cult clash. In another incident, a professional footballer who was on holiday in the state was reportedly killed by cultists in a drinking spot.

Violent Criminality: In November, a community leader was reportedly killed by unknown assailants in his residence in Ovia South-West LGA. Also, a 20-year old man reportedly killed a man and stole his motorcycle in Ovia South-West LGA. Separately, robbers reportedly attacked the home of a university lecturer in Egor LGA

and killed his 4-year old daughter. In another incident, two robbers were said to have been killed by police in Benin City.

Communal Tensions: In January, tension was reportedly elevated in Benin City, as chiefs from the palace of the Oba of Benin stormed the residence of a prominent chief to secure the shrine of the Oba. The chief who traditionally performs spiritual functions for the Oba was reportedly suspended for designating his house as a palace where he held court.

Protest: In December, there was a protest over the suspension of a traditional ruler, the Onojie of Uromi, in Esan North-East LGA. Separately, commercial bus operators reportedly protested following the murder of

their colleague by street gangs in Benin City. In January, ex-militants under the Presidential Amnesty program reportedly protested against the Managing Director of the Niger Delta Development Commission (NDDC) over allegations of financial misappropriation.

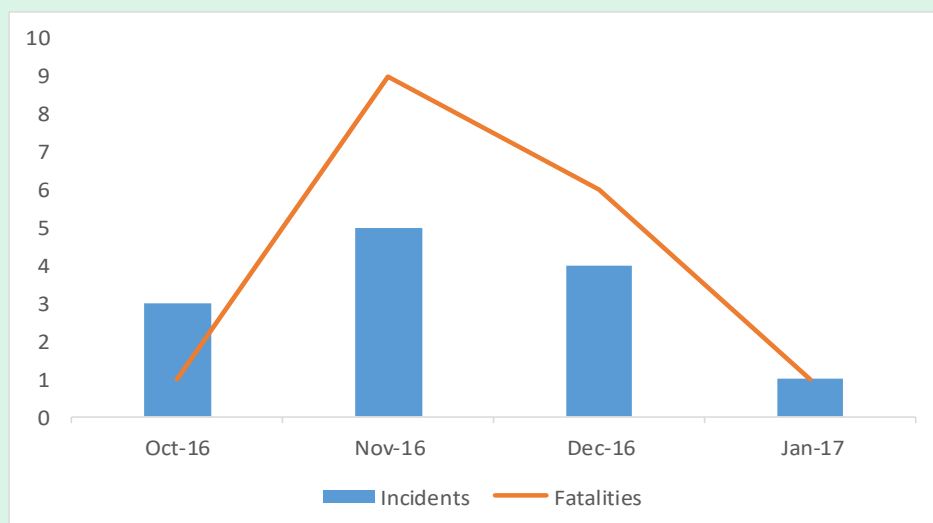
Other Incidents: In December, a man was reportedly killed by a stray bullet fired by a policeman at a wedding ceremony in Oredo.

Recent Incidents or Issues, February 2017

Incidents reported in Edo state mainly related to communal tensions, criminality, cult violence, and protests.

Violent Criminality: During the month, a 62-year old farmer was reportedly killed by his

laborers who then mutilated the body for ritualistic purposes in Owan West LGA.

Kidnapping: Three secondary teachers were reportedly abducted by kidnappers who demanded a 10 million Naira ransom in Ovia North East. Following the incident, students protested and barricaded a major highway.

Cult Violence: A man was reportedly beheaded by cultists in Benin City, the state capital. The incident was believed to be related to rival cult clashes in the state.

Prognosis

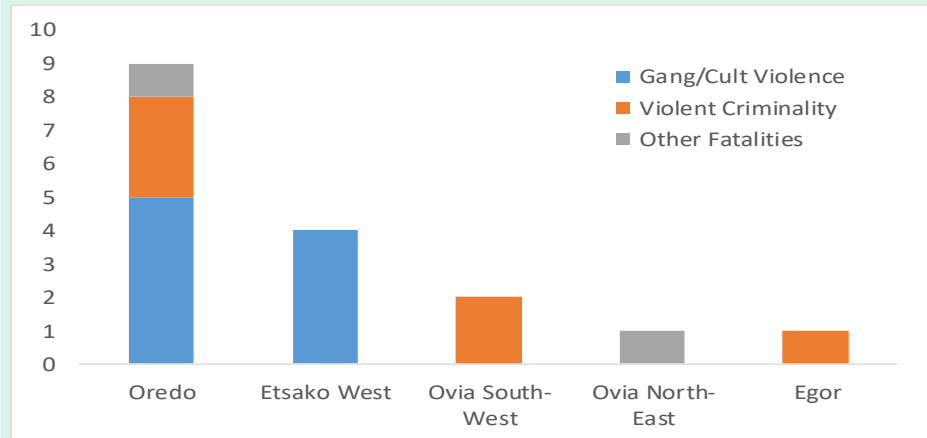
Recent reported incidents in the state related mainly to cult violence, protests, kidnapping, and other criminal activities. Peace Actors should monitor the security situation closely and respond appropriately.

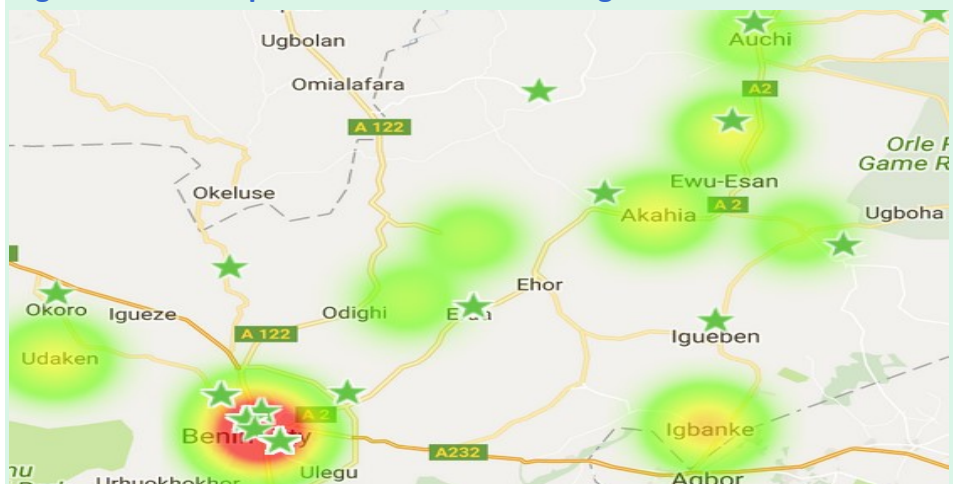
1. Is there anything significant missing from the tracker in terms of hotspots, trends, or incidents?
