This update spotlights organized criminal violence in the Niger Delta, focusing on the resurgence of kidnap-for-ransom in Ondo State. Recent data indicates a surge in kidnapping incidents, especially along highways and in rural communities. The rising trend poses a serious threat to human security and socio-economic stability in the State.





Anticipated Trends and Dynamics

Based on historical data and recent trends, kidnap-for-ransom could escalate, especially against the backdrop of economic hardship in the country. This poses significant risks to human security, potentially exacerbating insecurity and undermining stability in the state.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Security agencies are intensifying efforts through targeted operations in high-risk areas. Meanwhile, local peace actors and community leaders are collaborating on preventive measures, including early warning systems and situational awareness campaigns in the state.
