

Niger Delta Weekly Conflict Update

Mitigating the Escalation of Kidnappings and Targeted Killings in Imo State

May 11-17, 2025

This update highlights the growing threat of organized crime in the Niger Delta, with a focus on Imo State. Data shows a rise in kidnappings and targeted killings, particularly of travelers, by criminal gangs in the state. The prevalence of such violence underscores the urgent need for coordinated strategies to address and mitigate the situation.






Anticipated Trends and Dynamics

If left unchecked, the spate of targeted killings and abductions could escalate, deepening public fear and weakening trust in security institutions. Continued attacks on travelers and residents could destabilize communities and disrupt socio-economic activities in the state.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Security agencies have intensified efforts to combat organized crime through targeted patrols and coordinated rescue operations. Also, community leaders are working with law enforcement to strengthen intelligence gathering and improve response effectiveness.

Timeline of Recent Incidents of Targeted Killings and Kidnappings May 11, 2025 Gunmen abducted a 35-year-old woman in Umuhu community, Aboh Mbaise LGA, and demanded a ₩2 million ransom for her release. May 08, 2025 May 2025 Gunmen killed about 30 travelers and set many vehicles on fire along the Okigwe-Owerri Road in Amuro community, Okigwe LGA. May 06, 2025 March Gunmen reportedly abducted several travelers and killed a driver during an ambush along the Owerri-Aba Highway in Ngor Okpala LGA. March 05, 2025
