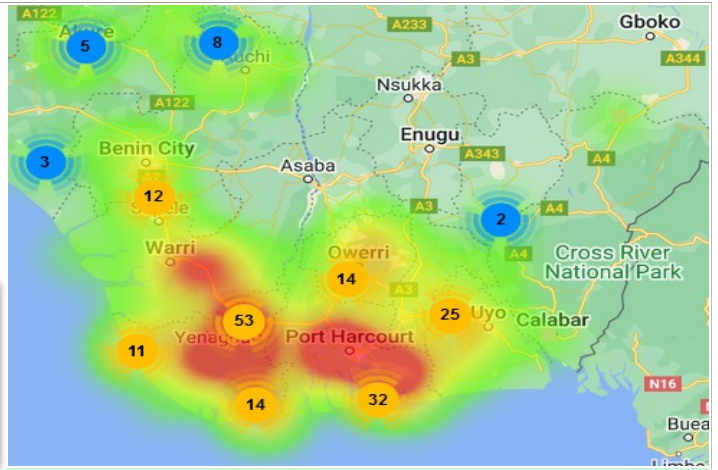


Niger Delta Weekly Conflict Update

May 31 - June 06, 2026

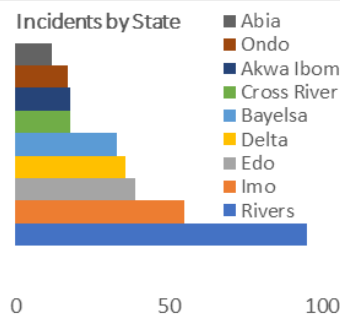
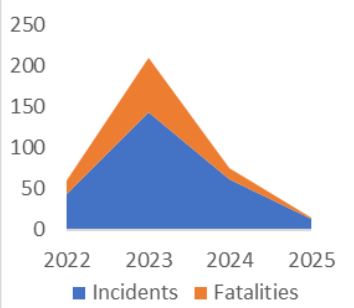
This update highlights emerging risks of political violence in the Niger Delta ahead of the 2027 General Elections. Recent electoral disputes, allegations of manipulation, and disruptions of party activities point to rising political tensions, underscoring the need for proactive measures to prevent violence and promote peaceful participation.

Anticipated Trends and Dynamics

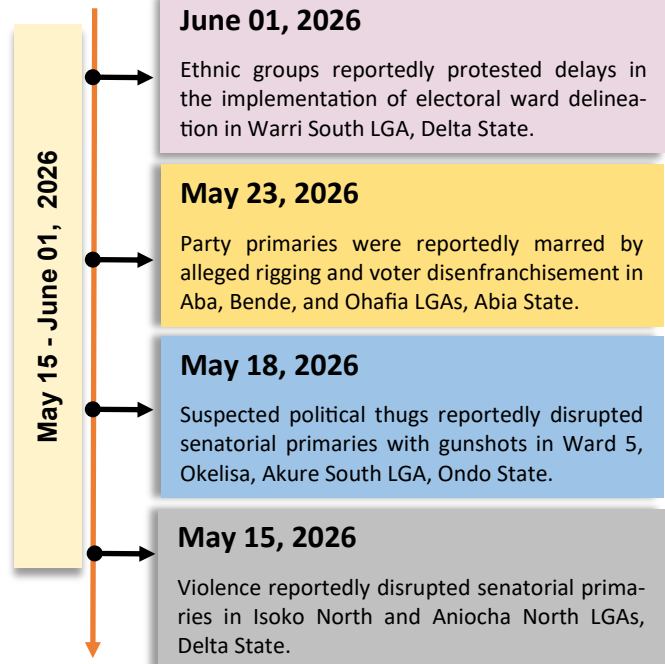
Political tensions may intensify as preparations for the General Elections gather momentum. If not addressed, electoral disputes and political intimidation could increase the risk of violence, erode public trust in the electoral process, and undermine peaceful participation.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Political parties and key stakeholders are deploying internal mechanisms to manage grievances and tensions. However, continued conflict prevention, early warning monitoring, and stakeholder engagement are needed to reduce the risk of political and electoral violence.
