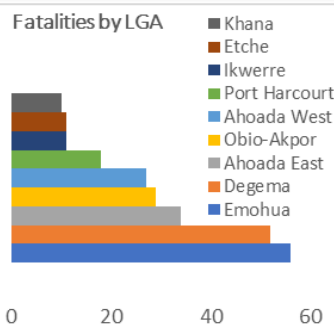
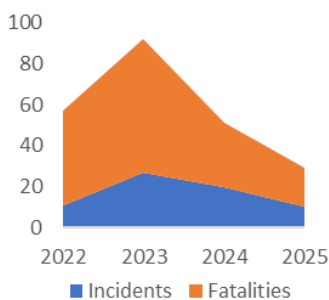
Strengthening Responses to Armed Violence and Insecurity in Rivers State

July 26 - August 01, 2026

This update highlights the evolving pattern of armed violence and insecurity in the Niger Delta, with a particular focus on Rivers State. Recent incidents involving targeted killings, kidnappings, and armed robbery have heightened concerns over public safety and community security, underscoring the need for strengthened security responses.



Trends and Geographic Hotspots of Criminal Violence in Rivers State

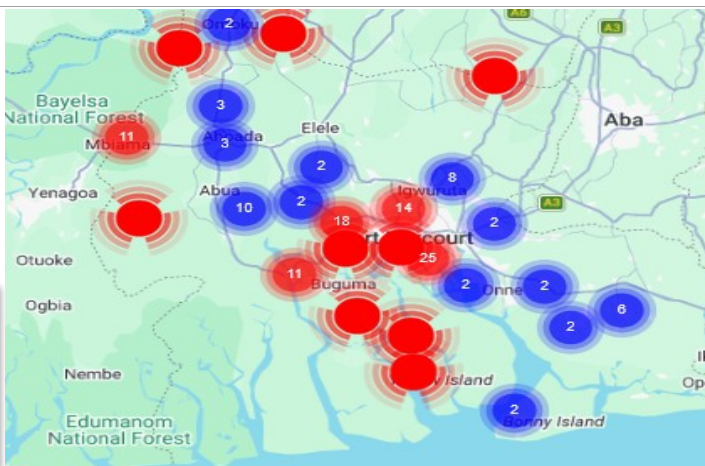


Anticipated Trends and Dynamics

The persistence of armed violence could heighten insecurity, increase public anxiety, and disrupt socio-economic activities. If not effectively addressed, these threats may erode public confidence in security institutions and undermine peace and stability in the State.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Security agencies have intensified joint security operations and increased security presence to disrupt criminal networks. Meanwhile, residents and civil society groups continue to advocate for stronger security measures and enhanced community protection.

Timeline of Recent Incidents of Organized Criminal Violence

July 26, 2026

Gunmen reportedly shot and killed a former Chief Security Officer along Polytechnic Road in Bori, the headquarters of Khana LGA.

July 25, 2026

Police reportedly arrested suspected members of a "one chance" robbery syndicate operating in Rumuosi, Obio/Akpor LGA.

July 20, 2026

Gunmen reportedly killed four persons, including a vigilante commander, during an attack in Omoku, Ogba/Egbema/Ndoni LGA.

June 29, 2026

Gunmen reportedly killed two police officers in an attack along the Mbodo-Aluu axis of Obiri Ikwerre Road, Ikwerre LGA.
